### **ABSOLUTELY REQUIRED TEXTS and ASTROLOGY SOFTWARE**

- 1. The Horary Textbook, Revised Edition by John Frawley
- 2. The New American Ephemeris for the 21<sup>st</sup> Century 2000-2100 at Midnight Michelsen Memorial Edition by Rique Pottenger, or any Ephemeris of your choosing. Make sure it covers dates far into the future.
- 3. Astrology software that will let you calculate a chart for your location and that offers the **Regiomontanus** house system. <u>Don't use any other house system</u>. I'm using <u>Solar Fire Deluxe Edition 9 by Astrolabe</u>, but you can get the charts online for free, just make sure you can read the chart print-out easily, you can select the **Regiomontanus** house system. If it doesn't have it, find another source that does.

### STRONGLY RECOMMENDED TEXTS

- 1. The Real Astrology by John Frawley this is the first book I read by John and it is why I decided to learn Horary astrology. I should say that John is pretty scathing about modern astrology and he's funny too, but I would like to say that modern astrology was probably the best introduction to astrology for me and for many others. It may not be precise and very good for predictions, but I still got quite a bit out of it and some healing as well.
- 2. <u>The Real Astrology Applied by John Frawley</u> In this book he shows how to begin to apply Horary astrology.
- 3. <u>Sports Astrology by John Frawley</u>- You don't have to be a sports fan to learn a LOT about Horary astrology in this book.
- 4. <u>Classical Medical Astrology, Healing with the Elements</u> by Oscar Hofman, if you find you want to learn more about medical Horary astrology, this is the best book on the topic.

- 5. <u>The Astrological Judgement and Practice of Physick</u> by Richard Saunders (warning, this was written in 1677, so the English is not the same English we speak today, you'll have to Google terms sometimes).
- 6. <u>Christian Astrology, Books I and II by William Lilly</u> (you can get free PDF versions online, or the paperback book at Amazon.com). Written by William Lilly in 1647, but after reading for about 20 minutes, you be amazed to find that you can actually understand most of what he is saying.

### **ASTROLOGY SOFTWARE**

I've been using Solar Fire for many years and now I'm using Solar Fire Version 9, but any astrology software that lets you use the <u>Regiomontanus house system</u>, even online sites where you can cast a free astrology chart, is fine.

## **Recommended Best Practices as a Horary Astrologer**

- It's a good practice to make notes on each chart within the astrology software, if you can. Note the client's name, the background information, your judgment of the chart, EVEN IF YOU'RE NOT SURE, and then later, when you know the outcome, note that in there too. This practice will increase your skill level tremendously.
- **Doing this** will increase your confidence and will give you valuable information when you want to write about Horary astrology or teach it later on. It's also great for research projects that would further our knowledge on Horary astrology and astrology in general.
- If your astrology software allows it, I recommend that you save your horary charts in different categories, such as Job-Career, Business, Relationships, Gay Relationships, Lost Objects, Medical, Court, Real Estate, Children-Fertility, Misc., etc. Have a Master Horary file in your computer software that just says Horary too so you can find your Horary charts by date. You'll be saving each Horary chart twice this way.
- **PRINT OUT EACH HORARY QUESTION YOU DO**. I had my hard drive crash two summers ago and I have not been able to retrieve my Horary charts from it since. But because I printed out most of the horary charts (so I could write on the chart), I've been able to

re-create most of the charts I lost before the summer of 2015. I organize these by client's first name so I can retrieve it quickly.

- For a long time, I created client manila file folders to store their horary charts and natal charts, but it became really cumbersome after a while since some people came only once for a consultation and others became regular clients over the years. I personally hate filing though, so maybe that's the real reason!
  - I do recommend that you find a way to keep track of all the horary charts that you will be generating so that you can get your hands on a particular chart when you need to. Some of you will be really good at this Mercury kind of thing, and some of you will be more like me, but we all need some way to keep track of everything.
- Have some kind of spiritual practice that you do regularly in order to keep your mind free, your ego out of the way, and your intuition sharp. It can be meditation, prayer, journaling, yoga, breathing exercises, etc. It just needs to be done on a consistent basis as it will help you to learn and be really good at horary astrology.
